

# KNOWN CREWMEMBER®

## ACCESS INFORMATION

- Who is a “known crewmember”? Any authorized aircraft operator flightcrew member or cabin crewmember traveling in uniform or out of uniform with an official airline photo ID and a government-issued photo ID. The KCM access points can be used for business or personal use; however, crewmembers on personal travel to an international destination must use a passenger-screening checkpoint.
- KCM participants are permitted to bring any personal items that are not on the Prohibited Items List through the KCM access point.
  - Prohibited items include
    - ◆ Tools
    - ◆ Explosives
    - ◆ Flammables
    - ◆ Sharp objects
    - ◆ Sporting goods
    - ◆ Self-defense items
    - ◆ Liquids, aerosols, and gels (LAGs)
    - ◆ Firearms (ammo, parts, and accessories)

- Prohibited items found in a KCM participant’s carry-on bag or on his or her person may result in TSA civil enforcement action, criminal enforcement action, and removal from the KCM system.
- Uniformed crewmembers may have LAGs that exceed the 3-1-1 rule at the passenger-screening checkpoint and KCM access points.
- Crewmembers not in uniform who are selected for random screening cannot retain their LAGs that exceed the 3-1-1 rule unless screened at the KCM access point or escorted by a transportation security officer to the passenger-screening checkpoint.
- KCM participants may be randomly selected for additional screening. If selected for random screening, it may occur at the KCM access point or at the passenger-screening checkpoint. The KCM participant must complete the screening promptly and as directed; failure to do so may result in a civil penalty.
- KCM participants cannot bring items that do not belong to them (e.g., items belonging to a spouse, partner, children, etc.) through the KCM portal.
- Pets and pet carriers are not allowed through the KCM access point and must be screened at the passenger-screening checkpoint.
- The TSA may impose civil penalties of up to \$11,000 and remove a crewmember from the KCM system for a KCM rule violation.
